SERMON NOTES

I. The danger of post-revival *legalism* (vv.1-3)

*Legalism is dependence upon moral law/works rather than faith when one stands before God (and others)

II. The danger of safe-housing the enemy (vv.4-9)

SERMON FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS

1. Describe the universal law of entropy, and how it can be applied to the book of Nehemiah and the worship of Israel.
2. Why is **chapter 13** an “awkward” ending to Nehemiah? (Hint: read **12:47**, then **13:10**).
3. What was the problem of the people’s response in **13:3**? What are some ways you go beyond what the Bible teaches?
4. What’s the difference between *conviction* and *legalism*? How is legalism dangerous (both theologically and practically)?
5. Describe what’s happening in **vv.4-9**. How does this illustrate worship entropy? How does Nehemiah counter this problem?
6. How does Christ fulfill what Nehemiah could not accomplish perfectly (hint: **John 2:13-21**)?
7. What is one sin (a “Tobiah”) you are safe-housing today in your heart?

Read Nehemiah 13 for next week’s sermon as we conclude the book of Nehemiah. Our next sermon series will be in the Gospel of Mark.
